Bob Hutton, Chair, called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

IV. Adoption of Agenda:

V. Approval June 8, 2022 CHA-Low Income Services Open Regular Meeting Minutes:

Mr. Hutton called for a motion to approve the June 8, 2022 open meeting minutes as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Hutton. Second by Ms. Oliveri. All Board Members voted "aye" and Mr. Hutton declared the minutes adopted as presented.

VI. Resolution 127: A Resolution to Authorize the Submission of a Funding Request the Columbia Public Schools Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Funds (ESSER) for the Moving Ahead Program.

Mr. Cole that CHA has submitted, for CPS review, requests for funding that would have the greatest positive impact on CHA's Moving Ahead After-School & Summer Program to the operation and expansion of the program.

- Teen Room Expansion, this would result in converting the current Teen Center into a 4th-5th grade classroom, the current 4th-5th grade classroom into a 3rd-grade classroom, the current 2nd-3rd grade classroom into a 1st-2nd grade classroom and the current K-1st grade into Kindergarten only.
 - o Estimated investment for Teen Room Expansion: \$25,000.
- Enhanced Educational Opportunities, MAP has several lessons focused on STEM and staff would like to partner with The University of Missouri's MU Engineering Program to start a robotics club. MAP also desires to create a small computer lab for MAP High School students who often have research projects they need to complete. MAP has students that lack internet access and/or home computer, therefore having a computer lab at MAP will help ensure this access. MAP would also like to partner with the STEAM Bus through the Columbia Stem Alliance.
 - Estimated Investment for Enhanced Educational Opportunities: \$10,000
- Competitive Teacher Salaries, due to CHA's current salary ranges, most MAP employees are college
 students that often move out of town upon graduation. This results in a high turnover rate that
 creates instability for the students in the classrooms. Incentivizing the hiring and retention of
 qualified staff requires additional funding for increased salaries.
 - Estimated Investment for Competitive Teacher Salaries: \$53,460

Executive Summary

Approval of the attached resolution authorizes the submission of a proposal to the City of Columbia for FY2023 Social Services Funding for the Moving Ahead Program.

Discussion

On July 18, 2022, the City of Columbia released a Request for Proposal for funding available through the City's Social Services "Opportunity Services". The term of this funding is January 1 - December 31, 2023 (FY2023) with the option to renew for one additional year (FY2024). Proposals for this funding are due by August 30, 2022 at 5:00 p.m. CT.

CHA staff is requesting approval to submit a proposal through CHA's CHA Low-Income Services, Inc. (CHALIS) entity to the City of Columbia for the Moving Ahead Program (MAP) for an amount not exceed \$75,000. The intent of this funding proposal is to supplement other funding sources that together enable effective operation of this program such as homework assistance, academic enrichments, meals, and active play.

In operation since 2003, MAP is a high-quality, state-licensed, after-school program offering an effective mix of one-on-one tutoring and fun cultural and physical activities for low-income children in Kindergarten through 12th grade. Moving Ahead relies entirely on grants and local donations for curriculum, supplies, and compensation for our dedicated staff.

With additional funding over the years, MAP has been able to successfully expand services to include family education and family development. This expansion incorporates staff, volunteers, vendors, etc., to assist with the family's mental and physical health and helps to educate the family towards self-resiliency.

Executive Summary

Financial Highlights for YTD June 2022

- Total YTD revenues are \$414,123
- Total YTD expenditures are \$435,548
- Overall budget to actual results reflects a YTD net loss of \$21,425. This should be resolved as we are able to begin billing additional units for the County Healthy Homes Connections grant.

Discussion

Revenues

- Federal grant revenue is \$36,539 above budget YTD. This is due mainly to the 21st Century grant, which supports the Moving Ahead afterschool program. Revenues were greater than originally anticipated in 2022 as the funding period ended in June and the full amount of approved funding was earned.
- County grant revenue is \$47,047 below budget YTD. The Healthy Homes Connections grant is \$70,619 below budget YTD as there were open positions in this program for much of the first part of the year. These positions have now been filled and we should be on track to receive the remainder of the 2022 funding. The County MAP program is \$23,571 above budget YTD as there have been many events organized and implemented in 2022 towards achieving the goals of this program.

Expenses

- Salary costs are under budget YTD by \$39,915 and benefits costs are \$18,536 under budget YTD because there were open positions during the first part of the year.
- Program activities/supplies are \$32,969 over budget YTD based on the events and activities held by the County MAP program and the increased summer activities of the Moving Ahead program.
