Re: Resolutions 137,138, 139: Consideration of funding proposal submissions for the Moving Ahead and

Healthy Home Connections Programs.

Executive Summary

Approval of the attached resolutions authorizes the submission of proposals to the Boone County Children's Services Fund and the Heart of Missouri United Way for Funding for the Moving Ahead and Healthy Home Connections Programs.

Discussion

On May 14th, 2024, Boone County Released a Request for Proposal for funding available through the Boone County Children's Services Fund. The term of this funding is January 1-December 31, 2025 (FY2025) with the option to renew for two additional years. Proposals for this funding are due June 26th, 2024, at 11:00 a.m.

CHA staff is requesting approval to submit a proposal through CHA's CHA Low-Income Services, Inc. (CHALIS) entity to the Boone County Children's Services Fund for the Moving Ahead Program for an amount not to exceed \$240,000. The intent of this funding proposal is to supplement other funding sources that together enable effective operation of this program such as homework assistance, academic enrichments, meals, and active play.

CHA staff is requesting approval to submit a proposal through CHA's CHA Low-Income Services, Inc. (CHALIS) entity to the Boone County Children's Services Fund for the Healthy Home Connections Program for an amount not to exceed \$120,000. The intent of this funding proposal is to support the continuation of the Health Home Connections Program, a program that promotes stable housing, strong families, and healthy environments for all families with children and youth 19 years of age or younger who receive housing assistance through the Columbia Housing Authority.

On June 7th, 2024, Heart of Missouri United Way Released the Open Letter of Intent for the 2025-2027 Education Impact Investment Cycle. The term of this funding is January 1-December 31st, 2025 (FY2025) with the option to renew for two additional years. The Request for Proposal for funding will follow.

CHA staff is requesting approval to submit a proposal through CHA's CHA Low-Income Services, Inc. (CHALIS) entity to the Heart of Missouri United Way for the Moving Ahead Program for an amount not to exceed \$85,000. This funding would supplement other sources that together enable effective operation of this program.
