support the Moving Ahead Afterschool and Summer Program.

#### **Executive Summary**

Approval of the attached resolution authorizes the submission of a proposal to the Veterans United Foundation for the Moving Ahead Afterschool and Summer Program.

#### Discussion

On November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2025, the Veterans United Foundation opened their Local Partner Review for funding. The term for this funding is January 1-December 31, 2026. CHA staff is requesting approval to submit a proposal through CHA's Low-Income Services, Inc. (CHALIS) entity to the Veterans United Foundation for the Moving Ahead Afterschool and Summer Program for an amount not to exceed \$55,000. The intent of this funding proposal is to supplement other funding sources that together enable effective operation of this program such as homework assistance, academic enrichments, meals, and active play.

#### **Recommended Commission Action**

Adopt Resolution 150 approving the proposal submission to Veterans United Foundation in support of the Moving Ahead Afterschool and Summer Program.



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#### **RESOLUTION 150**

To Authorize the Submission of Grant Application to Veterans United Foundation to support the Moving Ahead Afterschool and Summer Program.

WHEREAS, Veterans United Foundation is a non-profit charitable organization created and driven by the employees of Veterans United Home Loans, to enhance lives in their local communities; and

WHEREAS, The Veterans United Foundation is located in Columbia, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, CHA Low-Income Services, Inc. operates the Moving Ahead Program in Columbia, Missouri to serve vulnerable families and children with the goal of academic success and family self-sufficiency; and

WHEREAS, CHA Low-Income Services, Inc. has partnered with Veterans United Foundation to receive volunteer and financial support for the Moving Ahead Program since 2014;

THEREFORE, CHA Low-Income Services, Inc. desires to submit a grant proposal in an amount not to exceed \$55,000 to the Veterans United Foundation to support activities of the Moving Ahead After School and Summer Program for 2026;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of CHA Low-Income Services, Inc., hereby adopts Resolution 150 authorizing the submission of the application not to exceed \$55,000 from the Veterans United Foundation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the grant application should be approved, Resolution 150 also authorizes the execution of all applicable agreements with the Veterans United Foundation.
